Judge Reinhard Elected Dean Of The Law School.

Prof. William P. Rogers has resigned as dean of the Law School of Indiana University and Judge George L. Reinhard has been selected as his successor.

Prof. Rogers resigned to accept the presidency of the Cincinnati Law School. The appointment of



Judge Reinhard will meet with universal approval by the legal fraternity, students and the general public. His record as prosecuting attorney, circuit judge and judge of the appellate court, makes him popular with his fellow attorneys. His record as a professor of law in Indiana University is highly satisfactory and his promotion to the position of dean is deserved.

Judge Reinhard was born in Bavaria in 1843, and came to the United States in his 14th year and entered a manufactory in Cincinnati. In 1849 he moved to Union county Indiana, and during the war was a member of Co. I. Fifteenth regiment, and took part in many battles, including the siege of Corinth, Shiloh and Stone River.

In 1866-68 he attended Miami University and after locating at Owensboro, Ky., was admitted to the bar. In 1870 he located at Rockport, Indiana, and soon became distinguished for his ability as an attorney. He served as Prosecutor of the Second Judicial District in 1876, and from that position went from the circuit bench to the appellate court. In 1896 he was elected professor of law at I. U. In 1897 his Alma Mater, Miami University, conferred upon him the degree of L.L.D. and in 1899 Indiana University conferred upon him the A. M. degree. Judge Reinhard will be an honor to the chair of Dean of Indiana University.

The Trustees before adjourning tonight will select an instructor in the law school, and will consider bids for heating the new science hall. All the members are present except Mr. Fessler, who is in Europe.
