Introduction:

The Institutional Repository (IR) of the Indiana University Maurer School of Law has been operational since June of 2011. Created as a service of the Jerome Hall Law Library to collect and preserve the scholarship, publications, and archival material of Maurer Law, the collection now contains more than 10,000 items. These open-access materials have been downloaded more than 2.6 million times by users from more than 220 countries around the globe. This brief report documents the use and growth of the IR during the period September 1, 2015 to August 31, 2016.

New Content:

The 2015/16 academic year saw the creation of several new collections in the IR. Under the category of "Law School History & Archives" we added the following collections -

- <u>Arbutus</u> digitized pages from 10 editions (1894-1903) of the IUB yearbook, *The Arbutus*, that relate to the law school.
- <u>Class Composite Photographs</u> composite photographs of 47 law school classes between 1871 and 2016.
- <u>Notable Alumni</u> short biographies and pictures of 46 exceptional alumni. (Not surprisingly, the page for Judge Gonzalo P. Curiel, JD '79, received move views than any other, as a few weeks before the site went live Presidential candidate Donald Trump publically accused him of being a biased judge based on his ethnicity.)

In the category of "Faculty Scholarship" we added -

• <u>Books by Maurer Faculty</u> – individual pages for each book our current faculty have published (complete with links to purchase the books). While the vast majority of these pages are simply descriptions of the books, 6 contain the full text of the books.

Added to our already established collections were -

- Articles by Maurer Faculty 726 articles by current and past faculty members.
- <u>Law School Journals</u> 85 articles were added to the 5 journals published by the Law School, including the first 3 articles published in our newest online journal, The Indiana Journal of Constitutional Design.
- Theses and Dissertations 4 SJD dissertations, 1 LLM thesis, and 1 PhD. thesis.
- <u>Historic Documents</u> while only one document was loaded this year, it is of particular historic significance, the complete handwritten <u>Journal of David</u> <u>McDonald</u> - the Law School's first professor.

Downloads & Views

Bepress, the developers of the IR, introduced a new feature this year, a "Dashboard" that allows real-time viewing of statistics. Not only does this allow us to easily determine how many times an item has been downloaded, but we can now also pull up geographic and institutional statistics regarding each download. For instance, we know that during the year our IR documents were downloaded 653,050 times, to 224 countries, by 27,380 "institutions" (sites designated as Education, Commercial, Government, Organization, Military, and Library). We can narrow this down to learn very specific information about what institutions are viewing individual documents in our collection.

The dashboard also allows us to analyze "views" of our IR materials. This is particularly helpful for those materials that are not likely to be downloaded because they contain no attached file. For instance, the Notable Alumni collection (on-screen biographies) and our Books by Maurer Faculty collection (almost all of which are onscreen descriptions of the books).

2015/16 Loaded Documents, Top Downloads by Collection

The 1,132 documents loaded into the IR in 2015/16, were downloaded 13,865 times. Listed below are a few of the highlights

- Most viewed Class Composite Photographs: <u>Class of 1871, Indiana University School of Law</u>, 23 downloads.
