SCHOLARLY COMMUNICATIONS

Library Faculty Services is adding another author profile service to the mix, Web of Science, to further enhance scholarship findability and data tracking.

Web of Science is a global citation database with an extensive collection of interdisciplinary materials. The Core Collection, contains over 21,000 journals, 180,000 conference proceedings, 80,000 books, and covers 254 subject disciplines. This includes 460+ law journals. Web of Science's algorithm automatically generates author profiles, which display download and citation data. Authors can claim their profiles in order to view additional metrics and sync with their ORCID profiles.

The Library is continuing to manage SSRN uploads. New SSRN uploads are shared with the Law School's social media handlers for promotion. The Library also continues to maintain the [Faculty Bibliography](#) pages and the [Digital Repository](#).

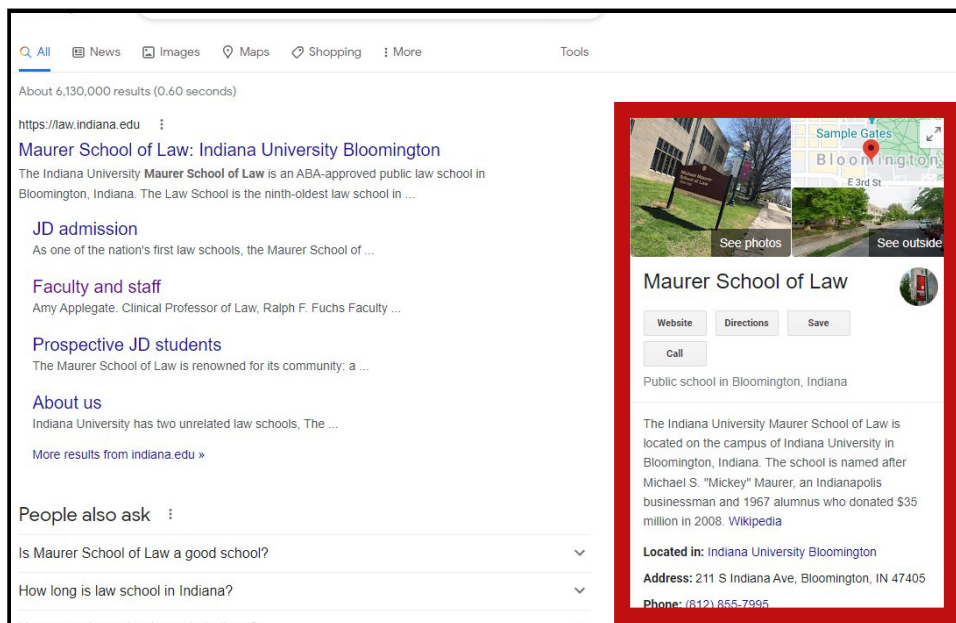

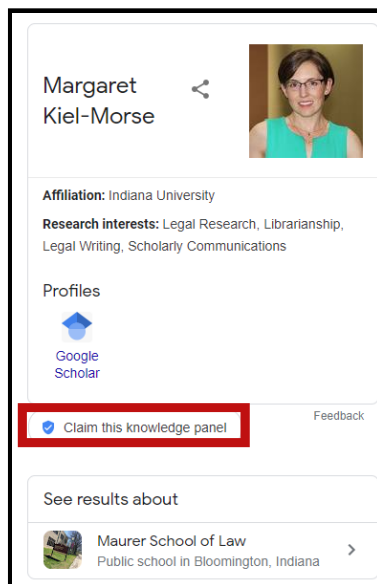
GOOGLE KNOWLEDGE PANELS

Knowledge panels are information boxes that appear on the Google search results page when a user searches for entities (people, places, organizations, things). A knowledge panel provides an automatically generated snapshot of information on the subject of your search, pulled from various sources across the web, including basic factual information with links and related content. When a user runs a search, Google's algorithms identify an entity in the search terms, analyze facts about the entity, and determine whether a knowledge panel will be helpful to the user.



One of the main benefits of a knowledge panel is that it stands out on the search result page, and makes it easy for users to quickly gain basic facts about the subject and access additional information. For faculty, a knowledge panel can enhance the findability of their scholarship.

Try searching your name on Google to discover if a knowledge panel is generated. Fair warning, a knowledge panel may not generate if you have a limited online presence. If a panel is generated, you can claim your panel, which enables you to edit the information that appears. Simply click the Claim link located beneath the panel and then follow the claiming process. You must be verified on Google in order to claim the panel. Even if you have a Google Scholar profile and other Google accounts, you may still need to get verified. Verification can take a few weeks to process through Google's systems. More information is available on the knowledge panel [help pages](#), or email Maggie at mkielmo@iu.edu.
