'The Goal of Life?'

Retired I. U. Professor Packs Mementos To Move to Florida

Bloomington, Ind., Jan. 30.—Hugh E. Willis, retired Indiana University law professor, said today he would move Wednesday to Fort Lauderdale, Fla. He will spend his summers, he said, at Fredericksburg, Va.

Professor Willis, 80, was law professor at I. U. from 1922 to 1945. Among the belongings he will pack are personal letters from Supreme Court justices, former Secretary of State Dean Acheson, presidential candidate Wendell L. Wilkie, and several United States senators.

He is author of several books and papers on constitutional law and other legal procedures. Chief

Justice of the Supreme Court Harlan F. Stone once wrote Willis: "You are the only one who has ever written on the Constitution of the United States who has the right approach to the subject."

At another time, Supreme Court Justice Benjamin Cardozo wrote: "I turn to your book often in hours of perplexity."

Professor Willis says in retirement he is writing a treatise on "The Goal of Life," which he classifies as "the greatest subject I have ever undertaken." He says he will continue work on the treatise at his Florida and Virginia homes.
