ALUMNI ADOPTS HOGATE MEMORIAL

High Tribute Is Paid to Former
Dean of Indiana Univer-
sity Law School.

A memorial to Enoch G. Hogate of Bloomington, Ind., former dean of the law school of Indiana university, who died last week, was adopted yesterday by the Indiana University Alumni Association at its regular weekly lunch-

eon at Hotel Lincoln. It was prepared by a committee consisting of Heze Pike, Herman B. Gray and Alvah J. Rucker.

"He was a lawyer of rugged honesty and fearlessness, commendably known as the pioneer type," said the memorial. "No legal complication was too great for the comprehensive mind of Judge Hogate to master and lucidly expound. His delicate sense of the proprieties, the dignity and honor of his profession made him a peer of any practitioner in this part of our nation.

"In 1903 his legal scholarship made him the choice of Indiana university for professor of law. In 1906, upon the death of George L. Reinhardt, no more fitting successor could be found for the position of dean of the school of law at the university than him whom we memorialize.

"Under Dean Hogate's administration the law school prospered. Its requirements were elevated and its stu-

dents were instructed in the better part; not merely in technical law, but in the morals, the beneficence, the philosophy and the public relationships of jurisprudence. In addition to his duties as dean and law professor, the president, William Lowe Bryan, and the board of trustees appointed him to the chairmanship of the committee on student affairs. In this position full opportunity was given to very exceptional qualities in Judge Hogate; the exercise of sympathy and kindly direction toward young men and women at the university. He will always be remembered as the earnest, sincere and genial friend of the under graduate.

But over and above his intellectual accomplishments and the honors bestowed upon him by his fellow-men, it can be said that Judge Hogate had that which he prized more highly than all of these—his membership in the Methodist church and his devout and humble service and belief in the re-

ligion of Jesus Christ and the New Testament. In an age, happily passing, wherein scholarship was often confused with scepticism, this college professor believed and consequently taught by word, precept and example these fundamental beliefs. He regarded the continued well being of his country as depending upon them politically as well as morally, and in his closing days confidently and calmly fixed his trust in the life eternal.

"The influences of his character, his active brain and generous heart, persist."

BOND ISSUE GRANTED.

Authority to issue \$460,000 in 5 per cent bonds was granted the Indiana Service Corporation in an order of the public service commission issued yesterday. The bond issue is to reimburse the treasury of the company for expenditures in making additions to its plant.
