BOSTON — William Burnett Harvey, 77, of Boston, died Oct. 27 at Beth Israel-Deaconess Medical Center.

He was born in Greenville, S.C. and raised in Erwin, Tenn. He was a Navy veteran of World War II, a graduate of Wake Forest College, and received a degree in law from the University of Michigan.

He served as dean of Indiana University School of Law from 1966 to 1971, and joined Boston University Law School faculty in 1973. In 1982 he became general counsel of Boston University, retiring from that position in 1987.

He was also professor of law at University of Michigan for 15 years. He was interested in African legal systems and wrote *An Introduction* The Herald Times Movember 10, 1999

to the Legal Systems of East Africa and Law and Social Change in Ghana. Survivors include his wife, Mary

Louise Harvey; one daughter, Anne Taylor of Newton, Mass.; one son, Kent Harvey of Hamden, Conn.; and

two granddaughters. Memorial services will be 1 p.m.
