RACIAL PROFILING: EXAMINING THE WEN HO LEE CASE

The Asian Culture Center is hosting a monthly, informal forum on Asian and Asian American issues, ideas, and experiences. The month the topic is "Racial Profiling: Examining the Wen Ho Lee Case." Professor Jeannine Bell will moderate the discussion on Wednesday, Sept. 20 at 7:00 p.m. at the Asian Culture Center.

Dr. Wen Ho Lee, a 60-year-old, Chinese American nuclear physicist, was arrested for mishandling classified information while working at Los Alamos National Laboratory. Although no evidence was found that directly linked Dr. Lee to the charges made against him, he was held in solitary confinement in a federal prison, without bail, for several months.
