FCLJ PANEL DISCUSSION ON MEDIA ACCESS TO EXECUTIONS THURSDAY

In celebration of its 10th year of publication, the *Federal Communications Law Journal* is hosting the third in a four-part speaker series. A panel discussion regarding media access to executions will be held at 1 p.m. on Thursday, March 27, in the Moot Court Room. There will be a reception in the Student Lounge immediately following the discussion. Panelists will include John Bessler (JD'91), author of *Death in the Darkness: Midnight Executions in America*; Ian Marquand, chair of the Society of Professional Journalists National Freedom of Information; Diana Penner, *Indianapolis Star* staff reporter and witness to the McVeigh execution; and Professor Trevor Brown, dean of the IU School of Journalism. Professor **Joe Hoffmann** will moderate the panel discussion.

Next week, adjunct Professor **Robert Meitus** (JD'00) and Rick Gevers, a talent agent for broadcast journalists, will discuss entertainment law for the fourth presentation in the FCJL series at noon on Monday, March 31.
