### **"Torture, Compassion, and the Exceptional Case"**

John Reeder, a professor of Religious Studies at Brown University and a visiting professor of ethics at Harvard Divinity School, will look at ethical aspects of the issues in his address, "Torture, Compassion, and the Exceptional Case," at 4 p.m. in Ballantine 149. The definition of torture and questions of when, if ever, torture is acceptable have become commonplace in recent

years. Reeder works primarily in Western philosophy and Christian ethics, with comparative interest in Judaic and Buddhist thought. His publications include *Source, Sanction, and Salvation: Religion and Morality in Judaic and Christian Traditions* and *Killing and Saving: Abortion, Hunger, and War*. He is associate editor of *The Journal of Religious Ethics*.
