OBITUARIES

Bennjamin E. Corwin, age 70, of the Putnam County Bar died at his home at Greencastle, Indiana, Monday, March 3, 1930. Mr. Corwin has been a member of the Putnam Bar since 1881 and at the time of his death was a member of the firm of Corwin and Gillen.

George H. Hester, age 59, of the Floyd County Bar died Friday, March 28, 1930. Mr. Hester had been engaged in the practice of law for about 40 years.

Fred Ramsey, age 36, member of the Lake County Bar, was killed in a railway accident Tuesday, March 11, 1930.

Judge Howard B. Maxwell, age 65, judge of the Parke County Court, died at his home in Rockville, Indiana, Monday, March 31, 1930. He has been Judge of the Parke Circuit Court for the past two terms and was at one time prosecuting attorney of Parke and Vermillion counties.

Judge Thomas B. Buskirk, age 86, Civil War veteran and former Circuit Court Judge of Orange, Washington and Jackson counties, died at his home in Indianapolis, Indiana, March 9, 1930. He was a member of the State Board of Tax Commissioners and later president of the Board of Regiments of the Indiana Soldiers' and Sailors' Monument. He also served as representative from Orange and Crawford counties in the lower house of the Legislature.

Fremont Alford, age 72, died at his home in Indianapolis, Indiana, March 1, 1930. He was former judge of the Marion County Criminal Court and also Deputy County Prosecutor for several years. He was an instructor in the Indiana Law School for twenty years.

Judge John E. Winn, age 74, general counsel of the Advance-Rumley Company, died March 12, 1930 at his home in LaPorte, Indiana. He was a member of the American Bar Association, Indiana State Bar Association, and LaPorte County Bar Association.

Judge Charles Friedrick, age 70, of Hammond, Indiana, died Wednesday, March 26, 1930.
