# PETITION OF BAR ASSOCIATION TO SUPREME COURT TO REGULATE PRACTICE OF LAW

Pursuant to instructions of the Indiana State Bar Association at the Mid-Winter Meeting its committee on Inherent Powers of Courts to License and Regulate the Practice of Law, has filed a petition as an

original action in the Supreme Court of Indiana and a brief in support thereof. The following is a copy of the petition with the caption and signatures omitted.

"The Indiana State Bar Association hereby respectfully petitions the Supreme Court of Indiana to exercise its inherent power, as the highest Court of the State, over all persons practicing or attempting to practice law in said state, to the end that, by its rules, orders and decrees or by such other means and procedure as it deems advisable, said Court may supervise, regulate and control the practice of law throughout the state of Indiana and thereby safeguard the public and protect the legal profession from any irregular or unethical conduct upon the part of any person or persons practicing law or conducting a law business within said state."
