Ralph D. Thrasher, Indianapolis attorney, was injured fatally in an automobile crash Monday, December 4th. Mr. Thrasher was a member of the Indianapolis Bar Association with offices in the City Trust Building.

Harvey W. Hartley, Miami county prosecutor, died November 7th. Mr. Hartley formerly taught school in Miami county and about eleven years ago entered the practice of law with Judge Hal C. Phelps. In 1930 he was elected prosecuting attorney of Miami county and re-elected in 1932.
