James S. Drake, age 81, former judge of Elkhart and Lagrange circuit courts, died Sunday, March 12, 1933, at his home in Goshen.

Judge James L. Clark, age 78, died at his home in Danville Wednesday, February 15, 1933. Judge Clark was one of the oldest practicing members of the Danville Bar Association, Judge Clark was formerly judge of the Hendricks Circuit Court, member of the Indiana Public Service Commission and a trustee of Butler University.

Austin H. Williamson, age 61, prominent member of the Jay County Bar Association, died at his home near Redkey Saturday, February 18, 1933.

Richard Vanderveer, age 66, prominent Milford attorney and leading citizen of Kosciusko County, died Tuesday, February 24, 1933.
