OBITUARIES

Orville W. McGinnis, senior member of the law firm of McGinnis, Waler and McGinnis, died Monday, February 12th, at Evansville. Mr. McGinnis graduated from DePauw University in 1892 and attended Cornell Law school, Ithaca, N. Y. He served seven years as referee in bankruptcy.

Mark Storen, former United States marshal for Indiana, died at his home in Scottsburg February 18th of a heart attack.

James Kilroy of Poseyville died February 25th at his home. Mr. Kilroy was a native of County Mayo, Ireland, but a resident of Posey County since he came to America at the age of 22. He was a graduate of Valparaiso University and later founded the Kilroy-Driscoll Normal School at Poseyville. He served two terms as prosecuting attorney of Posey-Gibson circuit court.

Don Douglass, of Logansport, died February 18th at the Cass County hospital. He was a member of the law firm of McHale, Douglass & Myers and legal advisor for the city of Logansport. He had also been prosecuting attorney for two terms.

Harold Kelly, attorney in Lawrence County for over a half a century, died at the Dunn hospital Friday, February 16th. Mr. Kelly graduated from Princeton University. He was a member of the Lawrence County bar association.
