NEWS OF BENCH AND BAR

Officers for the 1931-32 season were elected by the Allen County Bar Association at their annual dinner meeting in the Chamber of Commerce at Fort Wayne, Thursday evening, October 28. Sol A. Wood, former judge of the Circuit Court, was elected president; John Morris, first vice-president; Clyde W. Reed, second vice-president; Howard W. Shambaugh, secretary; Leigh L. Hunt, treasurer; Albert H. Thomas and John A. Aiken, trustees for two years.

Paul G. Davis was selected as the 1932 head of the Indianapolis Bar Association at a dinner-meeting at the Indianapolis Athletic Club Wednesday evening, November 4. Other officers were Homer L. Elliott, first vice-president; Frank C. Dailey, second vice-president; Donald S. Morris, treasurer; William C. Kern, secretary; Michael A.
