OBITUARIES

Judge James H. Rose, age 64, a prominent Fort Wayne attorney and a member of the law firm of Leonard, Rose, Flannigan & McGeevy, died Wednesday, January 13, 1932, at his home in Fort Wayne.

Jesse F. Weisman, prominent Bloomfield attorney and former chairman of the Green County Democratic Committee, died Tuesday, January 5, 1932.

Judge George A. Williams, age 58, judge of the Jasper-Newton Counties Circuit Court, died at Rensselaer, Sunday, December 7, 1931. Judge Williams had served as judge since November 24, 1920. He was a member of the State Bar Association, the Masons and K. of P.

Edward Franklin White, age 73, editor in chief of the law book department of the Bobbs-Merrill Company, died Saturday, January 2, 1932.

Charles S. Wiltsie, Jr., age 30, died Friday, December 31, 1932. Mr. Wiltsie was assistant counsel for the Railroadmen's Building and Savings Association.

Bernard A. Keltner, age 31, lawyer and former deputy attorney general under Arthur L. Gilliom, was killed in an auto crash January 1, 1932.

Theodore H. Ristine, age 86, died at his home in Crawfordsville Saturday, December 5, 1931. Mr. Ristine had been a trustee of Wabash College forty-nine years, was a veteran of the Civil war and was a prominent member of the State Legislature in the eighties. For years he had been a prominent lawyer in Crawfordsville and was vice-president of the Elston Bank and Trust Company.
