## OBITUARIES

Judge E. M. Swan, age 64, veteran Rockport attorney, died at his winter home in Harlington, Texas, Tuesday, April 20, 1932. Judge Swan practiced law in Rockport for 55 years, and served one term as circuit judge. At the time of his death he was the senior member of the firm of Swan, Simpson & Wandel of Rockport.

John B. Murphy, age 60, died at his home in Crawfordsville May 3, 1932. Mr. Murphy practiced law in the vicinity of Crawfordsville for more than thirty years.

Virgil H. Lockwood, age 71, Indianapolis attorney, died May 3, 1932, in Beverly Hills, California, where he had spent the winter. Mr. Lockwood was a member of the law firm of Lockwood, Lockwood, Goldsmith and Galt of Indianapolis. He was a member of the American, Indiana, and Indianapolis Bar Associations.

Milton L. Clawson, age 59, prominent labor attorney, died May 2, 1932. Mr. Clawson had been engaged in the practice of law in Indianapolis for many years.

Judge James S. Engle, age 85, well known retired lawyer of Winchester, died May 2, 1932. Judge Engle was a Civil war veteran and ex-judge of the Randolph circuit court.
