Monrad G. Paulsen, 62, Law Dean at Yeshiva U.

Monrad G. Paulsen, dean of the Benjamin N. Cardozo School of Law at Yeshiva University and vice president of legal education for the university, died Sunday at Montefiore Hospital in the Bronx. He was 62 years old and lived in Manhattan.

Mr. Paulsen was the author of "Abused Child Reporting Legislation" and the co-editor, with Sanford Kadish, of "Criminal Law and Its Processes."

He served as dean of the University of Virginia School of Law from 1968 to 1976 and was a professor at the Columbia University School of Law from 1956 to 1968.

Mr. Paulsen, who was a graduate of the University of Chicago Law School, had also been a Fulbright professor at the University of Freiburg in West Germany and a visiting professor at the Institute of Advanced Legal Studies at the University of London.

He is survived by his wife, the former Jenny Smith, and two sons, Christopher and Peter.
