

IU Law Professor ^{1/22/61} Gets Fulbright Post

Jerome Hall, Indiana University Law School professor, will travel to Freiburg University in Germany this summer as a Fulbright lecturer.

A previous State Department mission in 1954 took Hall to the Far East to assist in the legal reconstruction of Korea, and to lecture in Japan, Formosa, the Philippines and India.

In 1955 he lectured at the University of London and Queen's University in Belfast, Ireland, as a Fulbright lecturer.

LAST YEAR, under a Ford Foundation grant, Hall lectured in Mexico and South America. He has also lectured in Europe and Canada.

A member of the IU faculty since 1939, and winner in 1956 of the University's higher accolade in teaching, the Frederick Bachman Lieber Memorial award for distinguished teaching, Hall has contributed seven books on

criminal law and legal philosophy to the law profession.

In 1957 he was awarded to the University's highest academic rank with the title Distinguished Service Professor.
