

# Craig Appoints Prof. Hall to Judicial Council

Prof. Jerome Hall, of the School of Law, was appointed to the State Judicial Council by Gov. George N. Craig Wednesday. He replaces the late Bernard L. Gavit, former Dean of the School of Law.

The Judicial Council makes recommendations to the Governor and the Supreme Court on changes in the judicial branch of the State government.

Prof. Hall has degrees from the University of Chicago and Columbia University. He also attended the Harvard Law School.

He taught at the University of North Dakota and Louisiana State University before joining the I.U. faculty in 1939.

He has written extensively in legal philosophy and criminal law fields and is editor of the 10-volume "Twentieth Century Legal Philosophy Series."
